

Ebuka and the Elephants

His mother was angry and sent Ebuka to the bush to get firewood.


"Do not come home without

Ebuka turned around and saw that the voice was coming from the zebra.


"You can speak?" asked Ebuka.

"Who is trying to take your land?" asked Ebuka.


"Come with me, and I will show you," said the zebra.

Ebuka immediately forgot about his punishment and followed the zebra to its land. There he met many beautiful creatures of the land and sea.




He met all types of animals, including the kangaroo with its strong legs and big pouch. And the crocodile with its scary teeth.






And the rhinoceros with its horns.


And the camel with its hump.




And the giraffe with its long neck.




And the porcupine with its quills.

Each creature was special in its own way, but all of the creatures were kind and welcomed Ebuka.


They asked, "Have you come to help us?

"They are planning to attack




us. They to destroy us and take our land."

"They are planning to crush us with their big feet," added the tortoise.




"Why is this?" asked Ebuka. "Why can't you all live together in peace?"

The elephants laughed and said, "Nothing you can say will change the fact that we are big and you are small."


So Ebuka called a monkey and asked him to climb up a tall tree.

As the elephants were still not convinced, Ebuka decided to try one more time.


He called some birds and asked them to fly up high in the sky.
