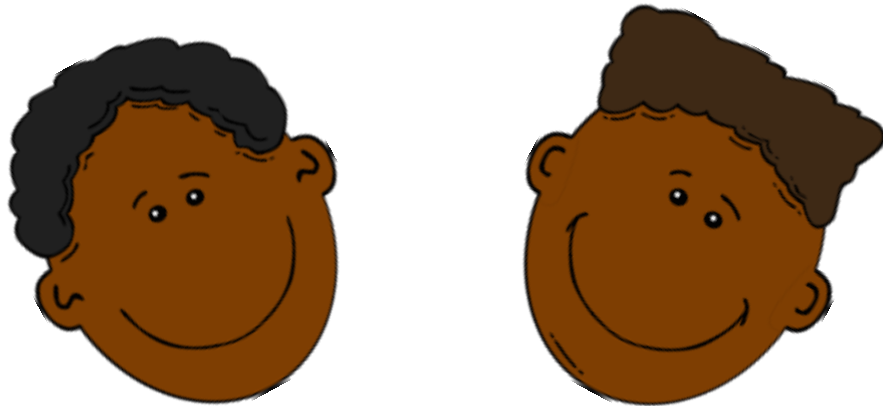

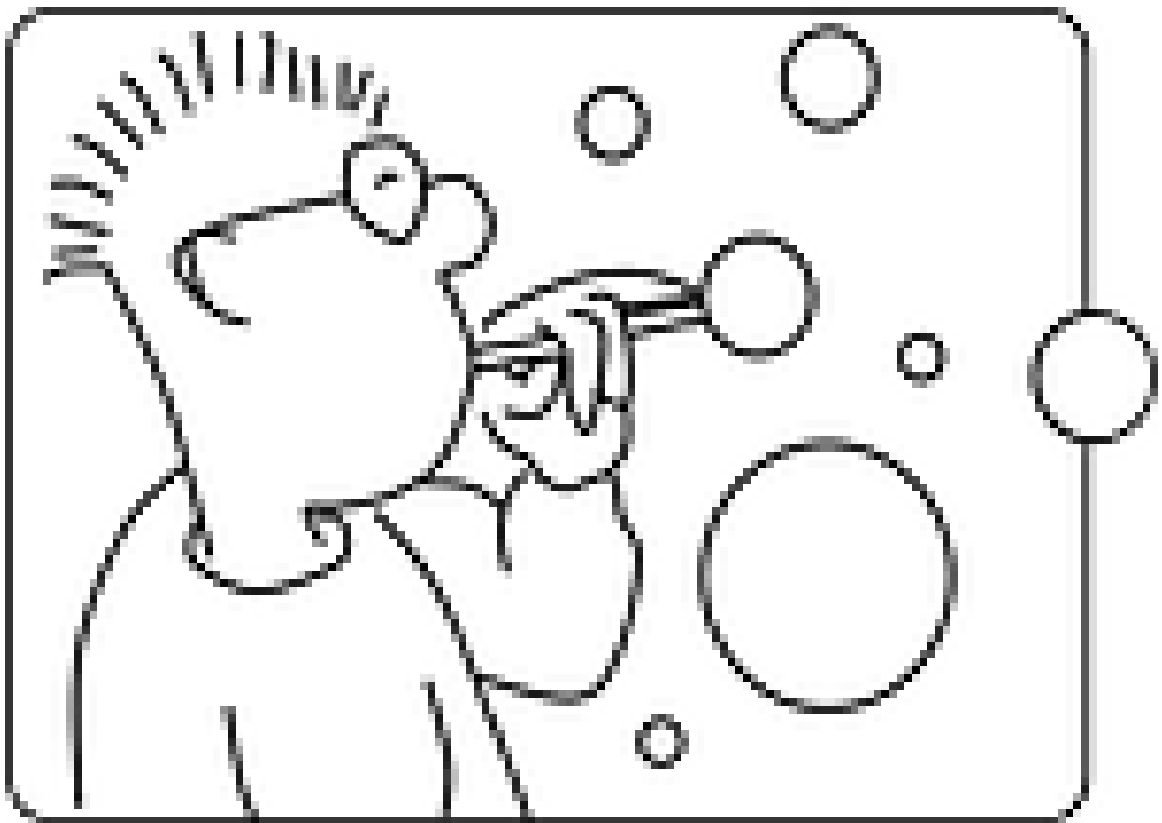
Once upon a time, there lived two boys.

good boy. Ahmad was a bad boy.



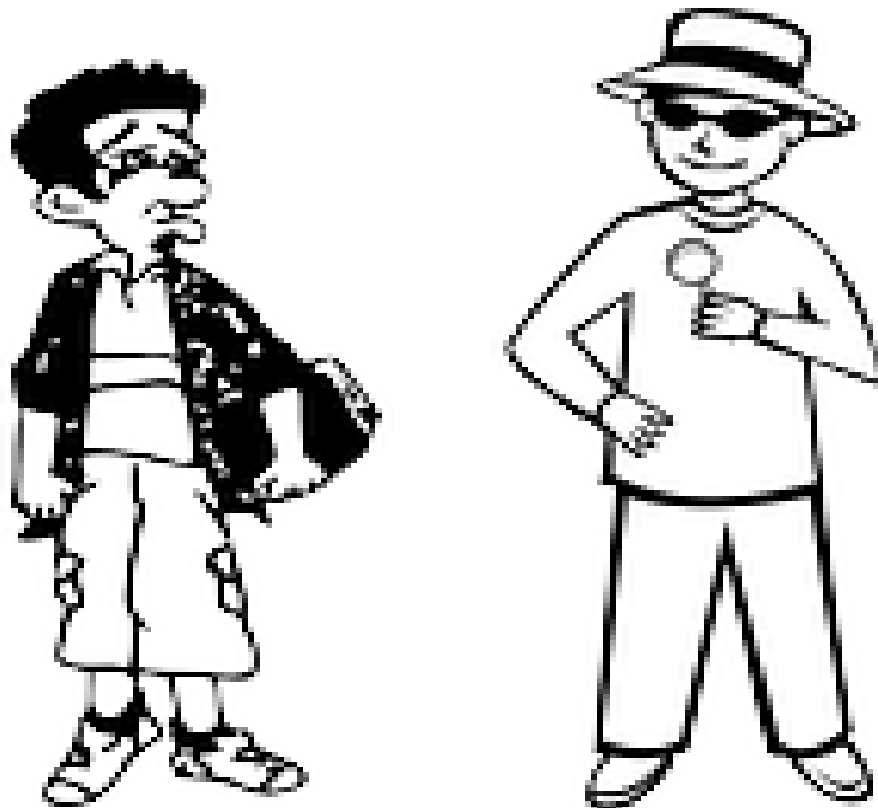
During break time, Yusuf played ball with his friends. Ahmad fought with other bad boys and made trouble.

Yusuf was a clean boy. He washed his clothes all the time. Ahmad was a dirty boy. He did not wash his clothes.





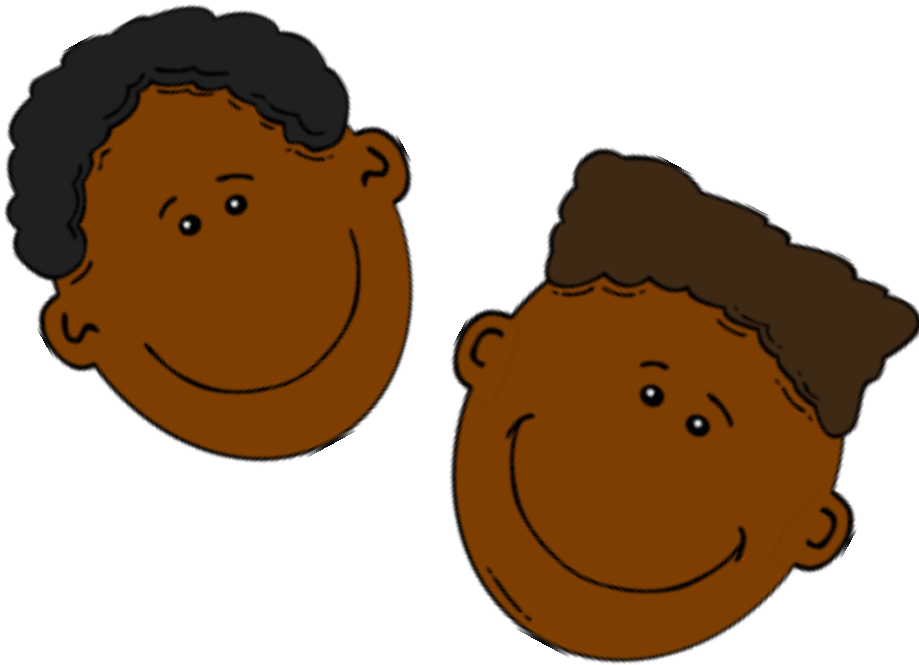
Yusuf always greeted his elders. Ahmad did not greet his elders.



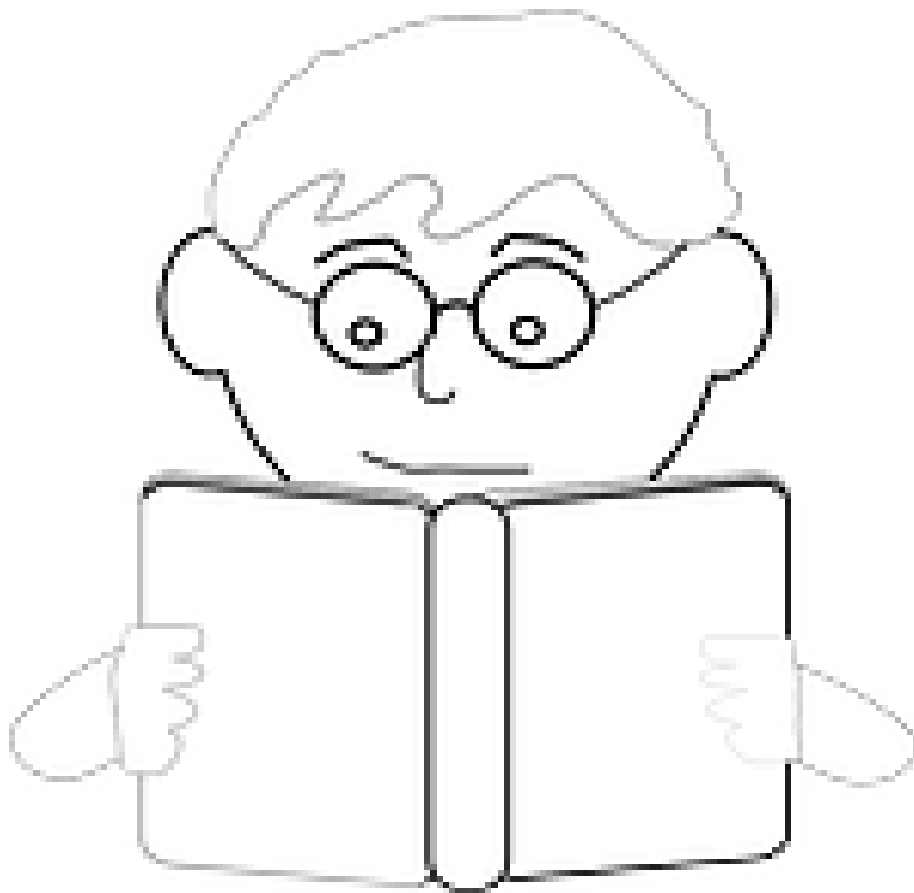
Yusuf's father always bought nice things for him. Ahmad's father always punished him.
