
In the village was a very cunning rabbit.




The rabbit wanted to marry the lion's daughter.




So he came up with a plan.




The rabbit told the lion to organize a race and let the lion's daughter be the prize.




He said many animals would run the race because of the prize. The lion agreed.




The zebra, the giraffe and the tortoise agreed to run the race




The rabbit was happy that the tortoise was going to run the race. He thought the tortoise was too slow to win.




On the day of the race, everyone was there.




The zebra started the race and ran very fast. After running for some time, he got tired and stopped running.




The giraffe also ran very fast. Along the way, he saw some nice berries. He stopped running and went to eat the berries.

The rabbit was far ahead of the tortoise, and so he decided to take a nap.




He thought the tortoise could not catch up with him.






While the rabbit was asleep, the tortoise walked past him and won the race.
